Exposure Bureau — third parties processing customer data

This document lists the third-party service providers ("subprocessors") that Exposure Bureau LLC ("Exposure Bureau") engages to process customer data in connection with its services.

This list is published at exposurebureau.com/trust/subprocessors and forms part of the Data Processing Agreement (DPA) by reference.

COUNSEL REVIEW

This subprocessor inventory must be kept current and customers notified of changes per the DPA notification clause (Section 3). Before publication, confirm each entry against contracts actually signed, and verify the notice period, objection window, and termination right against the executed DPA template. New subprocessor contractual terms (transfer mechanism, signed DPA, location) require legal sign-off.

1 Purpose

Exposure Bureau ("the Company", a US limited liability company) engages the subprocessors below to process customer data while delivering its recurring intelligence reports, one-shot diligence reports, and roadmap API access. The Company is report-first; it does not operate a self-serve dashboard.

2 How to read this list

- **Function** describes what the subprocessor does for Exposure Bureau.
- **Customer data processed** is the category of customer-controlled data, if any, that the subprocessor may process. Subprocessors marked **None** process only Company-managed data, never customer-supplied or customer-identifying data.
- **Region** identifies where the subprocessor performs the processing.
- **Transfer mechanism** identifies the lawful basis used for international transfers where applicable: Standard Contractual Clauses (SCCs), UK International Data Transfer Addendum (IDTA), or other recognized mechanism.
- **DPA in place** indicates whether Exposure Bureau has signed the subprocessor's DPA or equivalent.

3 Notification of changes

Exposure Bureau notifies active customers in writing at least fifteen (15) calendar days before adding a new subprocessor that will process customer-supplied data or computed indices identifying the customer. Customers may object in writing within ten (10) days of notice; objections in good faith trigger a discussion of mitigations and, failing resolution, a right to terminate the affected service.

Changes affecting only Company-managed (non-customer-identifying) processing are reflected in this list but do not require advance notice.

4.4 D. Licensed data partners

These subprocessors supply data to Exposure Bureau under license. The Company does not transmit customer data to them, with the exception of domain names and brand identifiers necessary to scope the provider's lookups. Customer-derived data is never resold or transmitted in raw form to these providers. All collection is from licensed partners and public, indexed sources only — no authenticated, invite-only, or vouched-access collection.
